

The Village News is back and with support from you, the Residents, and our valued advertisers, we hope it will once again be well received by everyone. So many of us have missed the Village News: not all of us have the Internet and it has become a vital link to what is going on in the locality.

I am sure you will join me in thanking John Rose for producing the Village News for the past 30 years, single handed and wish him well for the future. John is doing all he can to help relaunch the magazine.

I remember the 1st issue Aug/Sept coming out in 1976 and being asked if I would supply drawings for the front cover. Those concerned in getting "Charterville" (Minster Lovell Village News as it was known then) launched were; Brenda Bennett, Pat Bryant, Marlene Collett, Dot Ebsworth, Dawn Haley, Sheila Hunt, Kathleen Johnson and Janet Lock. It was 20 pages packed with club news, church services, reports from the Parish Council, meetings, sports fixtures, entertainments and even congratulations and best wishes to families celebrating the birth of a new baby!

In October 1979 issue 20 Oct/Nov there was a change of editors and it was edited and produced by Donald Holloway, supported by the previous Management Committee. Its format remained the same but by now, Residents were sending in poems, several of which were by Tom Smith who eventually published his own book of poems. Other Residents were writing about their personal experiences, for example, Sybil and Bill Williams invitation to Buckingham Palace to a Royal Garden Party as a thank-you for service to the community as a District Councillor.

Donald Holloway was one of Minster Lovell's finest cricketers but was tragically struck down at an early age with Multiple Sclerosis. There wasn't then a village publication until 1992 when John Rose took up the reins. He also introduced the advertising features.

Our new publication has taken advantage of modern techniques in digital printing and we have gone into colour. We will continue to print information on local charities and organisations. We shall endeavour to cover local stories and events and to produce features on local businesses. My Picture Framing Company will administer the publication from 130, Burford Road, Minster Lovell. The team comprises myself, Vicki Ashby and Roger Coggins.

As the editor I shall work to maintain and develop the magazine's profile and reputation. Any help with distribution and reporting on events will be most welcome! So your support and input is absolutely vital to the success of the publication!

Bats, but not necessarily in the Belfry!

St Kenelm's Church is a beautiful building dating from 1450 and lying next to the Minster Lovell



Ruins and river Windrush. This has been the focal point of the village for many years, but it is not just important for the people of Minster Lovell, but provides a residency for many species, including bats.

Some bats roost in the church all year round but during summer there are a number of maternity roosts there where bats breed, producing a single young female every year and nurturing them, in a similar way to us, to ensure the young survivors to live out their lifetime of 20-30 years.

I was born in Minster, but moved to Wiltshire for a decade or so where I worked as a Wildlife Conservationist at the Wiltshire Wildlife Trust, specifically the Otters and Rivers Project Officer there, but becoming the Wiltshire County Mammal Recorder for fifteen years. During this time I became interested in bats, which stood me in good stead when I left Wildlife Trust to become Consultant Ecologist, shortly after I moved back to the village with my new family.

I now run my own ecological consultancy from the village (not just covering bats, but many other species of wildlife) and a few years ago had to undertake a number of bat surveys around the church, finding there are maternity roosts of Natterer's and Brown Long-eared bats, with Common Pipistrelle, Soprano Pipistrelle and Serotine also roost there. Only the Long-eared bats were in the bell tower, the rest were in the roof. I also carried out a number of guided bat walks around the church and the ruins, during which we saw Daubenton's bats foraging over the river Windrush in addition to the species above.

As a side note, I went to St Kenelm's School a couple of years ago to move a Serotine bat out of a classroom and return it to its roost in the roof. These are one of the largest bats in the country and relatively rare, so it is good to have them roosting in the village and not just the church.

Hopefully in the near future we will be able to conduct another guided walk or two around the church to see which bats are there, although the pond in the ruins contains Great Crested Newts, but that's another story entirely.

As the summer draws to a close and some of the coronavirus restrictions have been lifted the Parish Council hopes that you have been able to enjoy time outside in the warmer weather, spent time with family and friends and that you continue to stay in good health. We welcome new residents to Minster Lovell and hope they will soon feel settled and part of Village life.

New Parish Clerk

The Parish Council welcomed Sharon Palmer as the new Parish Clerk at the September Parish Council Meeting. Sharon took over the role from Alex Molton with effect from the meeting. The Council thanked Alex Molton for her service as Parish Clerk for the past four years and presented her with a bouquet of flowers and a day out for all her family. Sharon has lived in the village for four years and is looking forward to meeting more parishioners in her new role.

Bus Shelters

You will be pleased to notice that the bus shelters on the Brize Norton Road have now been replaced and repaired. It is unfortunate that the bus shelter at the end of Charterville Close is being repeatedly vandalised. The Police are aware and if you see or have any information about this please, please contact the Parish Clerk or the Police directly on 101. You may have noticed that a seat has been installed in the stone bus shelter on the Burford Road and is already being well used by passengers as they wait for the bus. Thanks to the landlord of the White Hart for keeping the bus shelter clean and tidy.

Parking Issues

A number of residents attended the Parish Council Meeting on Monday 20th September to raise their concerns about parking and speeding issues in the village, particularly along the B4047, Witney to Burford Road and where parking on grass verges and on the corner of Upper Crescent is causing a danger for other motorist.

The Council agreed to raise these issues again with Cllr. Liam Walker, Oxfordshire County Council and the Police. The Council will be organising a meeting with the police and Parishioners were reminded that the contact number for the Police is 101 if individual residents want to report incidents at the time.

The Council agreed to take forward a proposal to see if we can get the speed limit on the B4047 reduced to 30 mph. It was noted that the white entrance gates and speed signs will be moved towards Burford so that they are before Dovecote Park on entrance to the Village from Burford

Allotments

The Council would like to thank allotment holders who are working hard to maintain their plots and keep the area tidy and safe. Some of the allotment holders are going to have a bountiful harvest! Ripley Avenue Path

As part of the housing development at Dovecot Park, it was agreed to install a path from the rear of the development to the Village through Ripley Avenue Park. Final decisions are being taken on the design and lighting of the path by Bovis and the Parish Council and we expect it to be installed during the autumn.

Dog Fouling

Unfortunately, we are hearing that dog fouling remains an issue in some parts of the Village, particularly Upper Crescent and Wenrisc Drive. Please make sure that you pick up after your dog and dispose of the waste safely. As part of the scheme across West Oxfordshire, separate litter bins and dog litter bins are being replaced by one bin both for general litter and dog waste. Some of the bins have been replaced and they will all be replaced over the next 12 - 18 months.
